

PREFACE

As per the guidance received from the advisors of the West Bengal State University, our institution Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya has attempted for the first time to undergo an ``ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE AUDIT ``

Abiding by the proforma provided by the University Experts, we have tried to collect the required information about our college, administration as well as academic.

A committee ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE AUDIT COMMITTEE was constituted for the purpose comprising faculty members, staff, members of the Governing Body, the Alumni (though not-yet constituted in the form of a registered organization).

The committee met frequently to discuss about the progress of the preparation of the report at least every 15days per month under the chairmanship of the Teacher-in-Charge.

The report commences with a brief message from the desk of the Teacher-incharge followed by an Executive Summary culled from the data furnished by the college office and departments since the last five years (2013-2014, 2014-2015, 2015-2016, 2016-2017, 2017-2018), followed by our STRENGTH, WEAKNESSES, OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES (SWOC).

The college profile and departmental profiles have been constituted on the basis of data (some retained still in the form of manual records but mostly in digitized forms – complete digitization is our goal during the present academic session-with the help of a data operator a new post to be sanctioned by the Higher Education Department). Some aspects of E-governance emphasized by NAAC has been introduced in our college such as : Bio-metric attendance, Online admission, Online recruitment of Non-teaching staff, Online package (finance for Cash & Accounts Sections), Library automation, Use of computers in office and departments such as Geography, ICT - Computer Science, Education, Virtual Classroom teaching and the like. Total vigilance throughout the campus through central monitoring of close circuit T.V. and cameras.



During the session 2018-19 some new developments have taken place not included within the present report since 2013:

Introduction of Physical Education as a pass subject meant for both Honours and Pass students.

A multi- gym received from the Dept. of Youth & Sports, Govt. of West Bengal.

Application for introducing PG course (Distance Learning) under Rabindra Bharati University has been made for students of the distant parts of the island who in spite of their merit cannot opt for their Masters Degree because of their remote residences and paucity of fund.

Some lacuna may be detected while examining the report as preservation of documents is always an acute problem of the college. Being located in an island and frequently inundated, the college building remaining submerged under water for a month when the office has to be run somewhere outside the campus.

Still we have tried our best to furnish all relevant authentic data in order to present a pen portrait of the academic and administrative ambience of Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya.







SWOC of the Institution

<u>Strength</u>

- 1) The N.S.S wing of the college ensures active involvement of the students in their social responsibility. During the academic year 2018 to 2019 a 7days special camp was organized by the N.S.S volunteers of Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya in Kalinagar village.
- 2) The College library housed in a separate building is an asset and heart of the institution, since the last three decades with near about twelve thousand books in the Science and Arts sections.
- 3) There is a girl's hostel, within the college campus, constructed by the financial assistance received from BCW Department, Government of West Bengal for the female students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Tribes. The girls students of our college avail it for themselves and receive financial assistance from the State Government for their sustenance in the form of stipends. A proposal for the sanction of Rs. 3,00,00,000.00 (Three Cores of rupees) for the construction of a Boy's Hostel from B.C.W, Department has been received by the college and the college is dealing with the matter on an urgent basis as the present hostel 30 years old is a ruinous state.
- 4) The Department of Geography of the college has a well equipped laboratory with computers with recent configuration and other necessary instruments to cater the requirements of students both of the Honours and General courses for their practical classes. Equally the Computer Science Laboratory of our college is well equipped with sophisticated computer system and internet facilities.
- 5) There is a large play ground full of green grass and encircled by green trees where our students play during their leisure time along with a multigym for students pursuing their degree courses (both Honours & General) taking Physical Education as one of their pass subjects.



<u>Weakness</u>

- 1) In 2009 the destructive cyclone "AILA" along with recurrent floods had destroyed our college main building, hostel, library and the like along with valuable documents and books. Even now after almost a decade we have not been able to come out of this deplorable plight a limitation debasing the overall development of the college.
- 2) Since then we have been straggling against all these odds such as space constraint in respect of academic and administrative building (shortage of classrooms as per new CBCS curricula and work load)
- 3) The next problem a very acute crisis shortage of man power. The college has only 14 teaching sanctioned posts including PH category posts in Political Science and ST post in Bengali, which are still vacant another impediment towards preparing ourselves for NAAC assessment and accreditation.
- 4) An acute shortage of fund that often inhibits our infrastructural developments is another weakness.
- 5) The topography and economic scenario of the locality is also not favorable.

Opportunity

- 1. The college is situated in a rural locale. The total area of the institution is 1454 acres with a pond, a playground, eco-friendly atmosphere – with gardens including a herbal garden and trees of varied species with opportunities for opening of new courses of study in the college for development of skill based disciplines such as fisheries, agriculture for students as per the requirement of the locality.
- 2. Keeping the topography of the region in mind a Multi-purpose Cyclone Center within the college premise has been constructed by the Government of India to provide shelter to the local people during floods.



The college provides safe and free drinking water to the local people in times of acute water crisis from its two sub marshal pumps situated within the campus.

- *3. The eco-friendly ambience provides health care for old and young people of the locality.*
- 4. The multi-gym enables the staff and students to maintain their health and rejuvenates them for the next day's work.

Challenges

- 1. The academic performance of the students is average, so there remains scope for improvement. The challenge is to motivate them for-quality performance.
- 2. Most of the students are first generation learners and guiding them through this pattern of educational system where the hours of classes including attendance is more important than before is an exciting challenge. Where the economic condition does not support to spare money for education, leading to increasing number of drop outs, it is a great challenge for us to bring them to the college on the regular basis.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya established on 1st May, 1985 in one of the remote island of Sundarban, now a world heritage site, stood as the sole torch bearer of higher education among the local tribes, caste Hindus and minorities. Riziculture and Pisciculture in the basin of River Betni are the primary occupations of most of the poverty stricken families, especially after the devastating AILA cyclone and also first generation learners. Formerly affiliated to the University of Calcutta the College affiliated under the West Bengal State University, Barasat, This Government-aided college has received both 2f and 12b affiliation certificates from UGC.

Since inception in 1985 total number of departments increased from six to eleven. Seven of them have both Honours and General Courses. Those are Bengali, English, Sanskrit, History, Education & Philosophy from Humanities section and Geography from Science section. Besides the honours programme the College have B.A. General Course for Humanities and Social Science section. With the subjects mentioned earlier the students also opt for Political science and Physical Education in Humanities group and Computer Science and Economics in Science for B.Sc General Course.

1) Does the College have academic flexibility?

Being a Government aided college affiliated to the West Bengal State University, there is no scope for academic flexibility. However at the entry level students choose their Honours and General Subjects. The College offer option for maximum number of General subject combination as extended by the University for the benefit of the students. However they may change their subject according to their choice within the stipulated time of registration under the University.

2) Interdisciplinary Programme and College involvement?

Though we have not started interdisciplinary courses but we have future plan to open multi carrier oriented interdisciplinary courses like Communicative English, Spoken Sanskrit, Creative Bengali writing, Proof Correction oriented courses etc in upcoming academic sessions.



3) Examination System

In previous 1+1+1 UG examination system the college have conducted centrally test examinations before the university examination form fill up started. Sometimes departments have organised short test/ unit test in the midst of academic sessions on their own. According to the Guideline of West Bengal State University we have started CBCS course in UG level from July 2018. The system provides six semesters to complete the scheduled course. Each semester contains a teaching period with internal and end semester examination of six months. Each student must complete the whole course within maximum period of five years.

4) Does the Department have different syllabus than the one used by the University for UG course?

The college is affiliated to The West Bengal State University and follows the UG syllabus prepared by the respective BOS of the University. So the UG departments have no chance to run different curriculum.

5) Number of teaching posts sanctioned, filled and vacant:

The college has 8 Assistant Professors, I Associate Professor (who is also Teacher-in-Charge) and 1 Librarian. We are also sending requisitions to The West Bengal College Service Commission for five vacant posts. We hope they will provide us new teacher to increase number of teaching strength shortly. Besides the UGC Approved whole time teachers there are 3 Government-Approved Contractual Whole time teachers, 13 Government -Approved Part-Time teachers and 5 Guest teachers who have been appointed from college fund for completing the course curriculum within specified University mentioned teaching period.








Pass percentage of honours departments

- 19) Curricular Aspects:
 - a) Does the faculty take initiative in curriculum process?
 Our faculty member who is also Teacher-in-Charge is a member of the UG Board of Studies of the Department of History, The West Bengal State University, She has participates in the curriculum development project
 - b) Does the Departments of the college offer programme with sufficient number of elective options?

At the entry level students choose their Honours and General subjects. Though a small college we provide maximum number of suitable options of combination subjects. However they may change their subject combination as per their choice within one month from he day of their admission maintaining the university guideline.

c) While framing curriculum is feed-back taken from stakeholder's viz students / Alumni / Parents / Employers considered?

The subject curriculum is designed by the university. So there is no scope for the college to opt for feedback from stakeholders.

d) What is the frequency of curriculum revision?

From July 2018 The West Bengal State University has implemented the course of CBCS in UG level of study. But previously frequency of curriculum revision in the case of different subjects was different. Few subjects such as Bengali has been maintaining the Calcutta University syllabus from the beginning. The syllabus remains unchanged till the CBCS syllabus was introduced. On the other hand some department had revised their syllabus from time to time.

e) Does the curriculum have emerging thrust areas, including interdisciplinary areas?

In the previous annual system at the UG level (1+1+1) most of curriculum had the opportunity of interdisciplinary study. So that a teacher had the opportunity to participate in multi disciplinary



curriculum beside own curriculum. For example in language section there was a connection between old Indian & European classical literature which was a part of curriculum in language based subject like Bengali, English and Sanskrit. In a similar manner such connection was noticed in the case of study between few subjects of Social Science like Education and Philosophy, Geography and Economics. So the faculty of our college is very much interested to participate in teaching programmes of other departments when possible.

In CBCS system there is a big scope for interdisciplinary study. In every course plenty of assignments has to be made for both own and other subject curriculum. In this system humanities and social science have no bar to communicate within the stipulated content of programme.

The college follows the academic calendar prepared by The West Bengal State University. Each department prepares a teaching plan



with the syllabus given by respective BOS of the University. In CBCS system the teaching plan has to be divided into two separate teaching zones. One is started from the beginning of the semester and continues till internal examination. Few subjects are planning to complete the syllabus according to direction from their respective BOS within 75 hours between these sessions. Rest of the session (after internal) have been specified for tutorials. While other subjects has their assignment to complete syllabus after internal examination within the timeframe of 90 hours. Besides regular faculty the college also recruit guest faculty for completing the curriculum in the case of vacancies.

e) Do you offer Bridge/Remedial Courses?

Every department of the college has taken remedial classes for week students on regular basis.

f) What is the method for conducting internal evaluation of the college?

The individual departments have some time plan to conduct short tests / unit tests on their own. The departments take initiative to arrange examination related issues like formatting examination schedule, question papers setting, planning of invigilation duty chart etc. The departments also arrange on their own responsibility practical examination of internal examination as well as University examinations. But college has taken full responsibility to conduct test examination for last five years and internal examination under CBCS system. The Examination sub-committee constituted by the college has centrally conducted the evaluation process in a very smooth way. The students are informed about their examination schedule through notice put up in the college Notice Board. The departments prepare questions; evaluate answer scripts within a stipulated time specified by the Examination Committee. The results are published before the commencement of the form fill up for University Examination.
