#### Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya

Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya was founded in 1985 on the first day of the month of May, in one of the remote islands of the Sundarban. Now a world heritage site, the college stood as the sole torch bearer of higher education among the local tribals, caste Hindus and minorities. Riziculture & Pisciculture in the river 'Betni' is the primary occupation for most of the poverty stricken families of the

island, especially after the devastating AILA cyclone.

Today as the college enters its 38<sup>th</sup> year; it looks back to a nostalgic past starting with only 47 students often hailing from first generation learner families till date, it has traversed a long way. Struggling against all odds, both natural and material, persisting even today the college tries to prepare itself for a challenging future.

# ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Formerly the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta, now it is under the West Bengal State University, Barasat. This Government Aided college has received both 2f & 12b affiliation from the University Grants Commission.

The college now has about 1030 students, 11 Assistant Professors, 1 Associate Professor (serves as the Teacher-in-Charge) and 1 Librarian. Besides there are 18 State Aided College Teachers. The total number of regular and management approved non-teaching staffs are 8 and 17 respectively.

Since inception the number of departments was 6, at present the number has increased to 11 (Honours in English, Bengali, Sanskrit, History, Geography, Education and Philosophy; General course in Political Science, Geography, Economics, Computer Science and Physical Education).

With the financial assistance of the Universty Grants Commission and the State Government (Department of Higher Education, Department of Tribal Affairs, Department of Sundarban Affairs, Public Health Engineering Department, MPLADS & BEUP grants) several attempts towards the improvement of the infrastructure of the college has been made such as:

❖ Installation of Aquaguard and water purifier and sub-marshal pump along with solar RO pump for purified drinking water

❖ Generator for enabling undisturbed continuation of regular activities in case of long hours of power cut.

- A rich library with books and journals, containing 13,000 books (approx.) along with eresources Library Management Support System.
- ❖ For the use of office, library and Geography and Computer Science laboratories several computers have been purchased and installed with latest configuration and internet connectivity along with Wi-fi.
- ❖ Installation of CC Cameras to ensure security of the campus.
- The college has a big play ground within a vast campus with an area measuring 14.54 acres along with a multigym both for the students, staffs and local youth.
- ❖ Both the laboratories Geography & Computer Science are well equipped with such modern equipments such as LCD projectors, arrangement for GIS training and the like.
- ❖ A virtual classroom (Smart Classroom) with all amenities for providing audio-visual transmission of knowledge.
- ❖ A meeting room with all modern amenities.
- New academic and administrative building (Annexure) under construction.
- \* Repair and renovation of the old academic & administrative building along with renovation of electrification of the same.

Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities such as games and sports, celebration of special calendar days, competitions, Social, picnics, excursions and NSS activities facilitating the process of creative and critical thinking are also simultaneously organized besides regular class room teaching.

The dedication and commitment of the college Governing Body, faculty and the supporting staff in their effort to attain this educational goal is to be applauded.

Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya library started its journey since the inception of college. Library being the heart of any academic institution, it aims to provide all the essential services to its students and staff.

#### Location

Library is situated in a separate building with a recording room along with a spacious stock room.

#### **Working Hours**

The college library is open to staff and students from 10.00 a.m. to 4p.m (Monday to Saturday) and each member has a facility of borrowing books from the library for a certain period of time.

#### **Library Resources**

The college library reflects a fascinating combination of tradition and modernity. It houses about 13,000 books on various subjects like literature, history, philosophy, social science etc.

Collection is continuously updated with changes in curriculum. Books of sundry types, like syllabus-oriented reference, general knowledge, research oriented are purchased from UGC grants as well as state government allotments.

It subscribes newspapers like Anandabazar Patrika and The Telegraph regularly. Subscription to NLIST service (e-resources through INFLIBNET) have been initiated by our college library. Library is Wi-Fi enabled for internet connectivity. Very recently, the library system became automated by AIMES cloud-based ERP LMS module and facilitates the patron with web-OPAC services.

#### **Rules**

- 1. Every staff / student of the college is eligible for membership of the library.
- 2. All students should sign the entry register of the library, before entering.
- 3. No student will be allowed to avail library facility without valid ID card and library card. The borrower cards are not transferable.
- 4. Users should maintain silence in the library & should not disturb other readers in the library otherwise library facility will be withdrawn.

- 5. Unauthorized removal of books or damaging the property of library or misbehaviour with library staff shall be considered as an act of indiscipline, which will call for strict action or fine.
- 6. In case library card is lost new duplicate card will be issued after submission of application and fine of Rs 10 in cash counter.
- 7. Books are to be handled very carefully. If a book is lost by the student, he/she shall replace the book (same title, author and edition) or shall pay double the cost of the book as fine.
- 8. Books are issued for a period of 21 days. Books must be returned on or before the due date otherwise the fine of Rs. 1 will be charged per day/book.
- 9. At the time of deposit of late fine one must collect receipt for the payment from the cash counter.
- 10. Absence & illness are not acceptable excuses for exemption from paying overdue charges.
- 11. If the due date falls on holiday declared by college, then students may return their books on the next week on scheduled day.
- 12. In spite of repeated reminders, if the book is not returned, the borrowing facility may be withdrawn for a period decided by the authority.
- 13. Library follows closed access system. Therefore, requisition slip must be made for lending books from the library.
- 14. Books borrowing limit: Faculty 5, Non-Teaching staff 2, Student (Hons.) 2, Student (Pass.)-1.
- 15. Using Mobile phones and audio instruments with or without speaker or headphone is strictly prohibited in the library premises.
- 16. All final year students should return their library token and library book based on library circular and obtain "NO DUE CERTIFICATE" from the library for getting Hall ticket.
- 17. Similarly, the staff members who intend to leave the college should settle all the dues and obtain "NO DUE CERTIFICATE" from the library.
- 18. Students should take care of cleanliness of the library.
- 19. Outsiders are not allowed in the library without the permission of the authority concerned.
- 20. All members of the library team are available for any assistance you may need in using the library resources, facilities & services. Library will welcome any suggestion for better use of library facilities

#### **Scope & Coverage**

This draft advisory shall supersede the existing regulation for 3-year (Six Semester) Bachelor of Arts / Science / Commerce programme under the Choice based Credit System (CBCS).

The University provides following three undergraduate programmes w.e.f. the academic session of 2023-24 under the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP) based on NEP 2020.

This advisory will be provisionally effective from the academic session 2023-24.

#### Single Major programmes

- (i) 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours) with Major in the field of Arts/Science/Commerce/Management (8 semesters with min. 180 Credits) (See Table 1).
- (ii) 4-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) with Major in the field of Arts/Science/Commerce/Management (8 semesters with min. 180 Credits). Students need to complete a research project of 15 credits in areas of their Major discipline in the 4<sup>th</sup> year of studies. (See Table 2)

#### **Multidisciplinary programmes**

(iii) 3-year Bachelor's degree with Multidisciplinary programme of studies in Life Sciences / Physical Sciences / Mathematical & Computer Sciences / Social Sciences / Humanities / Commerce & Management (6 semesters with minimum 125 credits. (See Table 3)

#### **Choice of Courses**

- (A) 4-year UG (Honours/Honours with Research) Course of Studies: Candidates will have to choose a single major discipline and any two minor disciplines along with the requisite numbers of AEC, SEC, MDC & VAC along with internship as shown in Table 1 & 2. The combination of major and two minor disciplines for the students admitted in 4 year UG (Honours/Honours with research) will be decided by the concerned college.
- **(B)** 3-Year Multidisciplinary Undergraduate (UG) programme of study: A candidate is required to choose **any three subjects** from **one** or **two broad** category of disciplines as offered by the concerned college. He/she will be awarded a 3-year B.A./B.Sc./B. Com. in a particular discipline provided that **at least two** out of the three subjects chosen by him/her falls in that particular category.

#### **Curricular Components of the Undergraduate Programme**

In accordance with NEP Curriculum Framework & Credit Framework 2020 the undergraduate programmes governed by this Advisory contain the following course components:

#### Major and Minor disciplines

Major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline.

Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of [18] credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded B.A. degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics.

In addition to major and minor disciplines, a student admitted in the 4- year Undergraduate programme (Hons./Hons. with research) has to take the following courses as shown in Table 1 & Table 2.

#### **Multidisciplinary Course (MDC)**

All UG students are required to undergo 3 introductory-level courses relating to any of the broad disciplines given below. These courses are intended to broaden the intellectual experience and form part of liberal arts and science education. Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class) in the proposed major and minor stream under this category.

The university will provide a list of courses under the 5 categories mentioned in the NEP document. Students will be asked to choose 3 different MDCs for 3 semesters.

#### Categories Multidisciplinary Courses from the following Disciplines

- 1 Life Sciences/ Chemistry/ Physics
- 2 Mathematics/Statistics/Computer Application/Economics
- 3 Library & Information/Journalism/Mass Media & Communication
- Travel & Tourism/Commerce/ Management/ Advertisement & Sales Promotion
- Defence Studies/Anthropology/Psychology/Human Rights/ Sociology/Political Science/Philosophy/History

#### **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)**

Students are required to achieve competency in a modern Indian language and in the English language with special emphasis on language and communication skills. These courses aim at enabling the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistics skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills, that help students articulate their arguments and present their thinking clearly and coherently.

#### **Skill Enhancement Course**

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on-training, soft skills to enhance the employability of the students.

Each of the AEC and SEC courses shall carry 3 credits. Students are required to choose three SEC courses from a pool of courses in their 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semester of study. In AEC, they have to study three courses (each of 3 credits) of either English or modern Indian language (MIL) in their 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> semesters of study.

#### **Value Addition Courses (VAC)**

These are courses that will help develop all capacities of human beings – intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and moral in an integrated manner. Each of these courses carries 3 credits. The colleges will choose one out of the three VACs offered by the university as mentioned hereunder.

- (a) Environmental Studies
- (b) Introduction to Cyber Security
- (c) Value of Yoga and Meditation in Life

Students will be required to pursue or study two value-added courses (VAC) each of 3 credits in their  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$  semester.

#### **Internship**

A course requiring students to participate in a professional activity or work experience, or cooperative educational activity with an entity external to the educational institution, normally under the supervision of an expert of the given external entity. A key aspect of the internship is induction into actual work situations. Internships involve working with local industry, government or private organizations, business organizations, artists, crafts persons, and similar entities to provide opportunities for students to actively engage in on-site experiential learning.

The student has the option to complete a 2-credit summer internship in a lab, industrial organization, R & D lab, or through community engagement, NSS, NCC as organized by the college. The student must complete a 2-credit summer internship by his/her 5<sup>th</sup> semester of study.

#### Final year Research Project/Dissertation

A student selected for pursuing 4-year Honours with Research programme is required to complete a

research project and submit a dissertation to the University for examination and evaluation in the 8<sup>th</sup> semester. This research project/dissertation work carries 15 credits.

#### **Awarding UG Degrees**

#### 4-year UG Degree (Honours)

A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 180 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in Table 1. Candidates who intend to continue in the 4-year UG programme have two options.

The candidates who have not secured 75% marks in each of the Semester (out of the first six semesters) over the period of first three years of his/her study are eligible for obtaining a Bachelor degree (Honours) in his/her major discipline. Such candidates must secure 15 additional credits in his/her major (Core) paper to be awarded a Bachelor degree (Honours) in his/her major discipline. i.e., Candidates must secure **105 credits** in his/her major (Core) discipline out of the total 180 credits to obtain a Bachelor degree (Honours) in his/her major discipline. (**See Table 1**)

The candidates who have secured 75% marks in each of the Semester (out of the first six semesters) over the period of first three years of his/her study are eligible for obtaining a Bachelor degree (Honours with Research) in his/her major discipline. Such candidates must secure **90 credits** out of the total credits of 180 from discipline-specific major courses (**Table 1**) and also needs to secure 15 credits through a Research project to be awarded a Bachelor degree (Honours with Research) in his/her major discipline. They should do a research project or dissertation under the guidance of a faculty member of that college. The research project/dissertation shall be in the Major discipline. Such candidates must submit a Thesis/Dissertation to the University for evaluation followed by a Viva-Voce examination. The concerned candidate **must score 150** or above out of the 300 marks allotted for Research/Dissertation work to pass or qualify for being awarded the degree of UG Honours with research in his/her major discipline.

#### 3-year UG Degree with Major

A student **admitted in a 4 years Honours programme** may exit after the 3<sup>rd</sup> year after completing 6 semesters (135 credits, **70 credits from Major** and **30 credits from Minors**) with 3-year UG degree with a Major. Such a student will also have the option to rejoin within seven years and complete the course.

#### 3-year Multidisciplinary UG Degree

A student may also opt for a 3-year multidisciplinary UG degree by securing a total credit of 125 (See Table 3) with 30 credits from each of the three disciplines.

The level of the three core courses for all three disciplines will be the same.

\*\* Conditions to be met by colleges offering a 4 year UG degree (Honours with Research) in a Major discipline:

The departments of the college offering a 4-year UG degree (Honours with research) must have the required infrastructure such as adequate library facility,

access to internet, access to journals, computer lab and software, laboratory facilities to carry out experimental research work.

The concerned department of the college must have at least two permanent faculty members who are recognized as PhD supervisors as per NEP 2020 guideline.

If a student becomes eligible for pursuing Honours with research in a college that lacks required infrastructure and eligible PhD supervisors, he/she may take transfer to another college, which satisfies the above conditions for offering Honours with research in the 7<sup>th</sup> semester depending on availability of seats.

#### **Credit Hours for Different Types of Courses**

- The workload relating to a course is measured in terms of credit hours. A credit is a unit by which the coursework is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (minimum 15 weeks).
- Each course may have only a lecture component or a lecture and tutorial component or a lecture and practicum component or a lecture, tutorial, and practicum component, or only practicum component. For example, a three- credit lecture course in a semester means three one-hour lectures per week with each one-hour lecture counted as one credit. In a semester of 15 weeks duration, a three-credit lecture course is equivalent to 45 hours of teaching.
- One credit for tutorial work means one hour of engagement per week. In a semester of 15 weeks duration, a one-credit tutorial in a course is equivalent to 15 hours of engagement.
- A one-credit course in practicum or lab work, community engagement and services, and fieldwork in a semester mean two-hour engagement per week. In a semester of 15 weeks duration, a one-credit practicum in a course is equivalent to 30 hours of engagement.
- A one-credit of Seminar or Internship or Studio activities or Field practice/projects or Community engagement and service means two-hour engagements per week. Accordingly, in a semester of 15 weeks duration, one credit in these courses is equivalent to 30 hours of engagement.
- A course can have a combination of lecture credits, tutorial credits, and practicum credits.

#### **Lab-based Subject**

Theory-3 credits (45 Hours); Practical-2 credits (30x2=60 Hours); Tutorial-1 credit (15 Hours).

#### Non Lab-based Subject

Theory-4 credits (60 Hours); Tutorial-1 credit (15 Hours); Field Work-1 credit (30 Hours).

The following types of courses/activities constitute the programmes of study. Each of them will require a specific number of hours of teaching/guidance and laboratory / studio / workshop

activities, field-based learning / projects, internships, and community engagement and service.

#### **Duration of the Programme**

The duration of the UG programme (Hnours/Honours with research) is 4 years or 8 semesters. Students who desire to undergo a 3-year UG Programme will be allowed to exit after completion of the 3rd year. Students may be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study but the total duration for completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years. The duration for Multidisciplinary UG Programme is 3 years.

#### **SWAYAM Courses**

SWAYAM Courses: The University may allow up to 20% of the total courses being offered in a particular program in a Semester through the online learning courses offered through SWAYAM platform subject to the following conditions:

- The course contents should be alike;
- The courses are not offered in the College;
- There is non-availability of suitable teaching staff to run the course in the College.

The University shall give the equivalent credit weightage to the student for the credits earned vide online learning credit courses through SWAYAM platform. However, the candidate will have to seek permission from the university, if he/she wants to replace regular class-teaching by Swayam course. Swayam courses will be allowed only for SEC, MDC and VAC but not for Major and Minor disciplines.

#### $Me chanism for \ Computation \ of \ Work-load$

The following mechanism shall be adopted for computation of work load.

- (a) 1Credit=1Theory period of one hour duration/week/semester;
- (b) 1Credit=1Tutorial period of one hour duration/week/semester;
- (c) 1Credit=1Practical period of two hours duration/week/semester;
- (d) 1Credit = Internship of 1 week/semester.

#### **Course Registration**

At the beginning of every Semester, all the students shall be required to register

#### Kalinagar Mahavidyalaya

for the Courses specified for that Semester of the Programme in the Office of the Controller of Examinations in the prescribed forms with payment of fees as prescribed by the University from time to time.

#### **Post-admission Stipulations**

- Colleges have the freedom to hold any number of tests and examinations of its own students. However, colleges will not hold any elimination/qualifying test in the midway for students admitted to the different Course of Studies.
- The evaluation and assessment pattern under CCFUP based on NEP 2020 will be regulated as per provisions of the regulation which will be in force at the time of the said examination. Any dispute regarding the above would be resolved by the relevant Examination rules and regulations set up by the University or by the Executive Council.
- It is expected that the semester examinations will be held every six months as per the academic calendar which will be duly intimated in advance by the University.

#### **Foreign Nationals**

The candidate (**Foreign Nationals**) will have to show "Original Copy" of Certificate of Madhyamik (or equivalent), Certificate of Higher Secondary (or equivalent) and original Passport (along with Student Visa) at the time of admission. **Foreign Nationals will have to pay the fees five times higher than the Indian Nationals.** Their papers must be duly endorsed by the local Embassies/Consulates/High Commissions, whichever is applicable and their visa period must cover the period required to complete the course.

#### **College Transfer**

Transfer of candidates from one affiliated college to another will be possible as per the provisions laid out in the regulation of NEP 2020 based CCFUP system which will be in force at the relevant time. However, in allcases such transfers will be effected after due approval of the application of the candidate concerned along with requisite non-refundable fees to the University administration without contravening the provisions of the Regulation in force. *All applications for transfer have to be made to the University authority within 30 consecutive days of commencement of the relevant semester. The applications must also contain the attendance of the student in that semester.* The University reserves the right to approve or reject such applications of transfer and it cannot be treated as a matter of right on behalf of the applicant concerned.

#### **Re-admission**

In case of discontinuation of Studies, the candidate concerned can be permitted only fresh admission with the issuance of new Registration (in cancellation of the earlier registration) after submission of an affidavit from a 1<sup>st</sup> class Judicial Magistrate that he/she has not taken admission under any other University/Institution in the intervening period. All such cases of fresh admission have to be preceded with the cancellation of earlier registration. For all such re-admission the provisions of this regulation in consonance with the Act and Statute of the University and the guidelines issued by the West Bengal Higher Education Council from time to time should be followed. However, after an exit at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> year after completion of stipulated 6 semesters mentioned in Table.1, the candidate will not have to re-register if he wants to complete the course within 7 years from the date of exit.





#### A candidate taking up Honours in a subject must have obtained

A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination. In case of Music (Hons.) 45% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject Music in the previous qualifying examination

Or.

55% marks in the subject or related subject in the previous qualifying examination

Or,

50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied

Candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled tribe category must have obtained 40% marks in the aggregate and 40% marks in the subject/related subjects at the previous qualifying examination (10+2 level) for being eligible for admission in the Honours programme of study.

However, if in any Honours subject, the number of applications is so low that even the permitted intake of the college cannot be filled up, then the Principal/Teacher-in-charge may use his/her discretionary power to relax the minimum requirement criteria for admission in that particular subject. A written communication in that regard must reach the Registrar for consideration of that decision for final approval by the Vice Chancellor of the University and the decision will be communicated to the Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal.

#### Candidates from other Boards

- 1. Students, who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils or State Boards/Councils including Open Schools and vocational studies, are eligible for study at the UG level.
- 2. Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) are not required to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.
- 3. Any dispute regarding eligibility criteria would be resolved by the Equivalence Committee set up by the University or by the Executive Council in its absence.
